At this time the Town Board made the following comments regarding the next Resolution:



Councilman Frank J. Bertoni said he is planning to vote no on the resolution due to the uncertainty of what will go on after the approval of the rezoning. He said this is not a reflection against the developing company.

Councilman Thomas R. Augostini explained that he had concerns with the project going forward, in that the majority of the building sits in the Village of Endicott. He was concerned that their newly formed Planning and Zoning Boards did not have the expertise or skillset to entertain two variances and site plan reviews for this project. This being said, he sent a letter to the Village of Endicott requesting that they consider working with the Town of Union's Planning and Zoning Boards to do a coordinated review of the project. The Village of Endicott was very receptive to the idea and is encouraged to work with the Town.

He said his second concern was how the company would manage the project after it was developed. He spoke with the developers and they addressed his concerns by clarifying the process for renter's investigations, including income verification, past 5 year landlord history requirements and background checks. He also visited both of their facilities in Syracuse and Oneonta. He was impressed with them and is satisfied with their reply to his questions.

Lastly, his final concern is the current condition of the property, what it is currently zoned for and what type of business could be in there now. He looked at the rendition of the plans for the future building, the cooperation of the Village of Endicott to work with the Town, and the results of his research to make his decision to approve the rezoning.

Councilman John M. Bernardo commended Councilman Augostini on reaching out to the Village of Endicott and for his research on this project. He also commended the Village of Endicott for recognizing their inexperience and their desire to work with the Town.

Councilman Robert Mack agreed that he is concerned that the building could end up worse than it is now and he does not want it to become a 1 North Page Avenue scenario. He said he also fears that another developer would not be up to par or to the same high standards as this company.

Roger Faling, 106 Bernetta Street, Endicott, thanked the highway crew for repairing Glendale Drive.
