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Supervisor Richard A. Materese recognized the 4-H UNITY Endicott Urban Neighborhoods Improved Through Youth group that promotes civic engagement, workforce preparation and asset development among youth in Endicott and Rochester, New York, conducted by Cornell Cooperative Extension of Broome and Monroe Counties in close partnership with New York State 4-H, Cornell University.
