<u>Resolution</u> to authorize Supervisor Richard A. Materese to approve the payment of \$53,116.40 for obtaining mitigation credits for the Daren Drive Stormwater Improvements project. Payment will be from the ARPA Funds.

<u>Resolution</u> to authorize Supervisor Richard A. Materese or Deputy Supervisor Thomas R. Augostini to sign the proposal from Highland Associates to Prepare Construction Documents to accommodate the New York State Police Substation. The fixed fee for this project is \$60,500.00 plus reimbursable expenses, and payment will be from the ARPA Funds.

<u>Resolution</u> to authorize Supervisor Richard A. Materese or Deputy Supervisor Thomas R. Augostini to sign the proposal from Griffiths Engineering for Engineering Services for the New York State Police Substation renovations. The fixed fee for this project is \$6,000.00 and will be paid from the ARPA Funds.

<u>Resolution</u> to approve the Supplemental Agreement #3 with NYSDOT for Hooper Road (CR 33) at Watson Blvd. PIN 9754.55, D035931. The work involves the intersection improvements of Hooper Road (CR 33) at Watson Blvd. This is a Locally Administered Project. The



estimated cost for the Construction and Construction Support and Construction Inspection work is \$472,768. The Town will be reimbursed 80% of \$472,768, or \$378,214, with Federal funds. In addition, the Town will be reimbursed 15% of \$472,768, up to \$70,915, with State Marchiselli funds. Authorization for the Supervisor or Deputy Supervisor to execute all such project related documents subject to review and approval of the Town Attorney.

<u>Resolution</u> authorizing Supervisor Richard A. Materese or Deputy Supervisor Thomas R.
