<u>Resolution</u> to call for a <u>Public Hearing</u> for **Wednesday**, **January 18**, **2023** at 7 PM to consider a Substantial Amendment to the Town's CDBG-CV and CV3 (CARES Act) Program and consider other budget changes to the Town's 2022 regular CDBG Budget:

- 1) Shift funds from certain unobligated COVID-19 relief activities to facilitate the installation of two Generators and three HVAC Systems located at Nichols Notch, 401 Hayes Ave, Endicott, NY (\$165,000.00); Harry L Apartments, 235 Harry L Dr., Johnson City, NY (\$160,000.00); and Wells Apartments, 299 Floral Ave, Johnson City, NY 13790 (\$65,000.00). Total allocation: \$390,000.00
- 2) Shift funds from certain unobligated COVID-19 relief activities to CHOW & Meals on Wheels of Western Broome. Each organization will receive \$75,000.00. Total allocation \$150,000.00

#### **Amendment Details**

1)

CDBG-CV & CV3: The Town will use CDBG-CV & CV3 funds to provide upgrades to three elderly, low-moderate income facilities within the Town of Union, Villages of Endicott and Johnson City, NY. The estimated cost for each upgrade is \$390,000.00 (\$165,000.00 Nichols Notch; \$160,000.00 Harry L Apartments; \$65,000.00 Wells Apartments).

The Town of Union will use approximately \$390,000.00 of unobligated CDBG-CV3 funding for these projects.

<u>CDBG-CV & CV3:</u> The Town will use CDBG-CV & CV3 funds to provide funding for CHOW and Meals on Wheels in the amount of \$75,000.00 each:

Nichols Notch HVAC: \$ 75,000.00 Nichols Notch Generator: \$ 90,000.00 Total Project Cost: \$165,000.00

Harry L Apartments HVAC \$ 75,000.00 Harry L Apartments Generator \$ 85,000.00 **Total Project Cost:** \$160,000.00

Wells Apartments HVAC: \$ 65,000.00



CHOW food/supplies: \$ 75,000.00

Meals on Wheels food/supplies: \$ 75,000.00 **Total Project Cost:** \$ 150,000.00

<u>Resolution</u> to award the Proposal for Professional Engineering Services - Street Reconstruction Project – 300 Block North Adams Avenue-Jenkins Street to Pine Street, Village of Endicott – Town of Union FFY 2022 CDBG Program to CPL Architects, Engineers, Landscape Architect and Surveyor, D.P.C. for no more than \$25,100.00 and have an estimated completion date of January 27, 2023.

**Resolution** to amend the contract with Gary Leighton to manage CDBG/LDC Bookkeeping Records for the Town of Union, from 100% payment from CDBG Funding to 80% CDBG Funding and 20% Town of Union Funding.

Resolution approving the Agreement between the Town of Union ("Town") and Mothers & Babies Sustainability & Growth Opportunities (M&BPN) provide \$200,000 of American Rescue Plan Act-Recovery Funds for M&BPN to complete their purchase of property at 338 & 346 Grand Avenue, subject to approval by the Town Attorney, and authorization for the Supervisor or Deputy Supervisor to execute the same.

<u>Resolution</u> approving the Agreement between the Town of Union ("Town") and the Endicott Rotary Foundation provide \$10,000 of American Rescue Plan Act-Recovery Funds for M&BPN to rehabilitate the George F. Johnson Memorial, subject to approval by the Town Attorney, and authorization for the Supervisor or Deputy Supervisor to execute the same.

<u>Resolution</u> approving the Agreement between the Town of Union ("Town") and the Oak Hill Avenue Improvement Corp (Oak Hill) to provide \$84,000 of American Rescue Plan Act-Recovery Funds for Oak Hill to renovate and upgrade the Little Italy Heritage Center to provide necessary improvements for the longevity of the Little Italy Museum and community space, subject to approval by the Town Attorney, and authorization for the Supervisor or Deputy Supervisor to execute the same.

**Resolution** approving the Agreement between the Town of Union ("Town") and the Southern Tier Community Center (STCC) to provide \$250,000 of American Rescue Plan Act-Recovery Funds for STCC to renovate and upgrade the STCC to provide multi-purpose spaces conducive to community programming—with a focus on Aquatics Programming, School Age Child Care, health and wellness programming, and community-based services, subject to approval by the Town Attorney, and authorization for the Supervisor or Deputy Supervisor to execute the same.
